COURSE: IST123 Diversity in a Technological Society

COURSE DESCRIPTION: Diversity in a Technological Society will explore the influences of technology to connect and collaborate to improve the lives of diverse individuals at home and abroad. Students are introduced to basic human relationship factors, international cultures, global communities, disabilities, issues relating to stereotypes, discrimination, power and privilege, and other cross-cultural social issues. Any technologies can be considered, but at minimum we will address human and data communications, robotics, artificial intelligence, computer security, and historical technologies along with the individuals who have influenced culture through them.

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

TOTAL HOURS OF COURSEWORK FOR ONLINE CLASSES:

To earn one academic credit at HCC, students are required to complete a minimum of 37.5 clock hours (45 fifty-minute “academic” hours) of coursework per semester per credit. Those hours of coursework may be completed through a combination of hours within the classroom and hours outside the classroom. Certain courses may require more than the 37.5 minimum hours of coursework per credit. For this particular class, a 15-week 3 credit class the average student would expect to work 9 fifty-minute “academic” hours per week (or 7.5 hours per week). Some students may need more and some students may need less for this course.
