**COURSE:** IST 173 Database Fundamentals – 3 credits

**INSTRUCTOR: SEMESTER/YEAR:** Spring 2018

**COURSE DESCRIPTION:** This course is designed to provide individuals with a complete introduction to database concepts and the relational database model. Topics include SQL, normalization, design methodology, DBMS functions. At the completion of this course, students should be able to understand a user's database requirements and translate those requirements into a valid database design. Prerequisite: IST 102 or consent of TCS Division. Semester offered: Periodically Three credits.

## TOTAL HOURS OF COURSEWORK:

To earn one academic credit at HCC, students are required to complete a minimum of 37.5 clock hours (45 fifty-minute "academic" hours) of coursework per semester. Those hours of coursework may be completed through a combination of hours within the classroom and hours outside the classroom. Certain courses may require more than the 37.5 minimum hours of coursework per credit. For most classes, students should expect to do at least 2 hours of coursework outside of class for each hour of in-class coursework.
