COURSE DESCRIPTION: Computer Forensics II provides a solid foundation for those seeking skills to investigate criminal and civil cases involving the use of computers. Hands-on experience is provided with operating systems, computer hardware and forensic software. The course is presented in lecture, lab and discussion format. Case studies are examined. Course objectives map to the EnCE Certification Exam and the International Association of Computer Investigative Specialists (IACIS) certification. Semesters offered: Spring Semester.

TOTAL HOURS OF COURSEWORK:

To earn one academic credit at HCC, students are required to complete a minimum of 37.5 clock hours (45 fifty-minute "academic" hours) of coursework per semester. Those hours of coursework may be completed through a combination of hours within the classroom and hours outside the classroom. Certain courses may require more than the 37.5 minimum hours of coursework per credit. For most classes, students should expect to do at least 2 hours of coursework outside of class for each hour of in-class coursework. What does this mean for you – since this is a three credit hybrid class presented over a 15 week period you would work on this class 9 academic hours per week including class time.
