Course: NUR 114-Practical Nursing Through the Lifespan II **Date** 2/15/18

Course Description:

This course focuses on the needs, problems, and nursing care of patients with mental health-illness, social interference, and medical/surgical issues. Communication, mobility, infection control, hygiene, therapeutic (medication or as ordered by the physician), and other activities of daily living are stressed. In order to progress in the Nursing Program, a grade of 75% or above must be achieved on all exams and a 75% or above must be attained on all course requirements. A grade of 90% or above must be attained on a dosage calculations exam in this course. Classroom, skills lab, and clinical experiences. Laboratory fee required. Total of 68 hours of lecture, 2 hours of laboratory, 16 hours of simulation exercises, and 64 hours of clinical.

• Prerequisite: NUR 113 with a grade of "C" or better.

Incorporate the nursing process to provide care to individuals with complex healthcare needs.

- Perform basic inspection, palpation, and auscultation.
- Report deviations in a timely manner.
- Establish nursing diagnosis based on deviations identified.
- Integrate classroom and clinical lab learning into the care of individuals.
- Evaluate individual's response to nursing care.

Demonstrate safety measures when providing care to all individuals in various settings.

- Prepares adequately for clinical experience.
- Dressed in clean school uniform and required accessories.
- Displays principles of safety when providing care.
- Perform skills in accordance with criteria learned in skills lab, as indicated.
- Perform skills in accordance with criteria that follow the facility's policies and procedures.

- Collaborates with staff in organizing individual's care.
- Reports to staff and instructor at end of clinical experience.
- Participates in morning report.
- Participates in individual care conferences.
- Participates in group therapy/activities.
- Documents accurately utilizing appropriate medical terminology.
- Adheres to HIPPA guidelines.

Work together with the healthcare team in providing care to the individual.

- Participate in individual care conferences.
- Participate in group therapy/activities.
- Collaborate to organize care with staff to plan for continuity of care.

Adjust work plan to improve organizational skills and available resources.

- Use time wisely.
- Complete care by the end of the assigned clinical experience.
- Minimizes use of unnecessary supplies.

Explore opportunities to promote personal and career growth.

- Attends educational conferences as available and arranged by the instructor.
- Participate in learning opportunities during clinical rotations.

Demonstrate continuity of care for multiple individuals.

- Organizes care with the facility team members.
- Verbalize plan of care in preconference to instructor & revise plan of care in postconference.
- Reports to appropriate team member the care of the individual at the end of the clinical assignment.
- Begins to recognize self-evaluation and communicates learning needs to instructor.
- Assumes responsibility for own actions.
- Reports to clinical on time.
- Completes the clinical assignment.

Minimum Click Hours Required for this Course:

To earn one academic credit at HCC, students are required to complete a minimum of 37.5 clock hours (45 fifty-minute "academic" hours) of coursework per semester. Those hours of coursework may be completed through a combination of hours within the classroom and hours outside the classroom. Certain courses may require more than the 37.5 minimum hours of coursework per credit.

For most classes, students should expect to do at least 2 hours of coursework outside of class for each hour of in-class coursework.
