COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course provides supervised clinical experience in area facilities and practice sessions in class for the skills learned in EMS 151 and EMS 161. Course fee required. Total of 115 hours of clinical and in class seminars.

TEXTBOOK: PES Practical Manual provided to the students

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

- Utilize the appropriate rules of conduct concerning communication and interpersonal relationships.
- Demonstrate competent placement of intravenous catheters, intubation tubes, and other devices, as trained in the paramedic program classroom.
- Accurately document patient encounters through the use of physical or electronic documentation systems.
- Explain the role of key hospital personnel and departments in continuing the care begun by paramedics.
- Obtain 10 successful IV cannulations, 10 medication administrations, 10 blood draws, 5 airway managements and interventions, and 10 patient assessments
