Expected Learning Outcomes:

• Demonstrate clinical dental hygiene skills and assessment procedures under self assessment and direct observation conditions.

- Apply comprehensive dental hygiene process of care strategies that incorporate assessment, planning, implementation for the child, adolescent, adult, geriatric, special needs and medically compromised patients.
- Demonstrate competence in assessing periodontal diseases and implementing nonsurgical periodontal therapy treatment and disease prevention strategies.
- Apply critical thinking and problem solving skills in a variety of clinical situations.
- Create clinical patient assessment documents that adhere to legal and ethical standards.

Assessment: Assessments include Periodontal Case Study (2.5% of overall grade), Clinical assessments (7.5% of overall grade), CA rotations (2.5% of overall grade), Radiographs (7.5% of overall grade), Clinical Patient Care (80% of overall grade). Students are required to achieve an overall grade of 85% or better on all components, as well as overall course grade of 85% or better.

Validation: This is a Clinical course, in which the course grade is determined by completion of all course assessments with a goal of 100% of students achieving an average of 85% or higher.

Results: These results are based, on one student who was enrolled in the course during the Spring, 2019 semester.
