Course Description

This course provides an introduction to systems analysis and design view for developers and systems analysts. The course presents an overview of the information systems and the system development life cycle. Emphasis focuses on tools and techniques that developers or analyst use to document information systems. Classical and structure tools for describing data flow, data structure, process flow, input and output design will be applied to documenting systems. Emphasis will be placed on the integrated use of the classical and structure tools. The course will survey other important skills for the systems analyst such as fact-finding, communications, project management, and ethics in the information age. 3 credit hours

Definition of Credit Hour: Classroom Courses
