## **Course Description**

In this course, students are expected to become familiar with security's core concepts, terminology, technologies and skills. Introduction to Cyber Security is a beginning guide for anyone interested in computer security. Major security topics such as vulnerability assessment, virus attacks, hacking, spyware, network defense, passwords, firewalls, VPNs and intrusion detection are covered. Crucial issues from industrial espionage to cyber bullying are discussed. Additionally, students are expected to learn the latest computer attacks and counter measures. Semesters offered: Fall and Spring. 3 credits.
