Course Description

In this course, students will learn industrial electric motors, generators, and transformers. Topics include three-phase circuits, saturation and hysteresis, eddy currents/losses, DC motors, AC motors, synchronous machines, induction machines, and the properties of various types of transformers. Total of 30 hours of lecture.
