Course Description

In this course, students will do a comprehensive study of the principles and techniques of modern digital systems. The course will teach the fundamental principles of digital systems and cover thoroughly both traditional and modern methods of applying digital design and development techniques, including how to manage a systems-level project. Definition of Credit Hour: Classroom Courses
