Course Description

Through computer-based instruction, students will learn to key the alphabetic, numeric, and symbol keys to touch to develop a fundamental keyboarding skill. This individualized approach to learning allows for more student/teacher interaction. Credit-by-exam testing is available for this course.

Student Learning Outcomes

- Students should be able to key a minimum of 25 words per minute with two or fewer errors using the correct fingers and with proper form and ergonomic techniques on both the keyboard and the 10-key numeric keypad
- Students will be able to proofread their work by finding and identifying their errors.

Course Content Objectives

- To operate by touch the letter, number, and symbol keys
- To demonstrate proper keying technique
- To identify and count keying errors and determine speed
- To key 28 words a minute on a two-minute timing with no more than two uncorrected errors
- To use the correct spacing with punctuation
- Use of the numeric keypad

Definition of Credit Hour: Classroom Courses

To earn one academic credit at HCC, students are required to complete a minimum of 37.5 clock hours (45 fifty-minute academic hours) of coursework per semester. Those hours of coursework may be completed through a combination of hours in the classroom and hours outside the classroom.
