Course Description

This course offers installation, configuration, support and troubleshooting of XP, Vista, 7 and 8; and preparation for CompTIA Operating Systems Technologies exam. The fundamental competencies for A+ Certification are covered. Topics include hardware requirements for installation, upgrades, customizing the user environment and memory, installing hardware/software, troubleshooting the boot process, and recovery from OS crashes. The fundamentals of networking include OSI model, TCP/IP, addressing, and troubleshooting tools. Laboratory fee required. Prerequisite: IST 108 or keyboarding exemption test (may be taken concurrently with IST 108) and IST 102 or consent of instructor. Semesters offered: Spring. 3 Credits

Definition of Credit Hour: Classroom Courses
