COURSE: RAD 212 – Cross-Sectional Anatomy

3 Credits

SEMESTER/YEAR: SU 18, FA 18, SP 19

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course enhances the student’s knowledge of sectional human anatomy. Using computed tomographic and magnetic resonance images, diagrams and computerized software, anatomical sections of the extremities, thorax, pelvis, abdomen, spine, head and neck in the transaxial, sagittal and coronal planes are studied. Course fee required. Total of 45 hours of web-based instruction.

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

At the completion of this course, the student will be able to:

1. Define the anatomy demonstrated and the image plane for the following anatomical sections (given a cross-sectional image):
 - A. Head
 - B. Spine
 - C. Abdomen
 - D. Male Pelvis
 - E. Female Pelvis
 - F. Chest
 - G. Neck
 - H. Joints
2. Define the role cross-sectional imaging plays in patient care.

Identify pathology demonstrated within cross-sectional images

TOTAL HOURS OF COURSEWORK:

To earn one academic credit at HCC, students are required to complete a minimum of 37.5 clock hours (45 fifty-minute “academic” hours) of coursework per semester. Those hours of coursework may be completed through a combination of hours within the classroom and hours outside the classroom. Certain courses may require more than the 37.5 minimum hours of coursework per credit. This 3 credit course achieves the minimum of 112.5 hours of total time by requiring 50 hours of instructional time and 62.5 hours of student work outside of instructional time.
