### **Course Description**

Students will install, customize and maintain server-based open-source content management systems including blogs, wikis, and custom content types. This is the capstone class for the WEB program and students will participate in a group service learning project as well as create an online portfolio and resume site. Course fee required. Prerequisite: WEB 110, WEB 210 and WEB 215 or consent of TCS Division. Semesters offered: Spring. 3 Credits.

## **Definition of Credit Hour: Classroom Courses**
