COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course provides supervised clinical experience in various settings for the skills learned during the first program year. Total of 120 hours of clinical and in class seminar. Course fee required. Prerequisites: EMS 210, EMS 211, and EMS 281

TEXTBOOK: PES Practical Manual provided to the students

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

- Perform all paramedic skills as a team and ALS Leader in the clinical setting and during field internship.
- Work as part of a team in evaluating and treating patients in the hospital and prehospital environments.
- Demonstrate positive patient and team interaction.
- Document patient interaction, including patient complaint, signs/symptoms, physical exam, history, diagnostic treatment, and treatment.
- Perform a cumulative amount of 10 pediatric assessments, 40 adult assessments, 30 geriatric assessments, 10 trauma assessments, and 40 Team Leads and 15 ALS Team Leads.
