COURSE: 164 Cardiology and Cardiovascular Diseases

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course introduces students to cardiac electrophysiology, electrocardiography inter-pretation and the assessment and management of patients with cardiovascular emergencies. Total of 45 hours of lecture. Course fee required.

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

- Relate anatomy and physiology of the cardiovascular system to cardiac rhythm generation and to the pathophysiology and assessment of patients with cardiac disorders
- Demonstrate proper detailed assessment of the cardiac patient.
- Demonstrate the steps in BLS and ALS interventions used in management of cardiac disorders.
- Demonstrate applied knowledge of Maryland State Drug Protocols for dysrhythmias and cardiovascular complaints.
- Perform ECG Monitoring and Rhythm Strip Analysis for most common dysrhythmias.
- Obtain a 12-Lead ECG and identify STEMI patients.
- Demonstrate the safe administration of medications allowed in your scope of practice under the supervision of a lab instructor or clinical preceptor, including medications administered by percutaneous, pulmonary, enteral, and parenteral routes.
