COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course presents specific training in pediatrics, including life-span development, pediatric assessment and management, and Pediatric Advanced Life Support. Additionally, issues of, and approaches to, patients in special populations, including pediatrics, geriatrics, bariatrics, and others with special needs are covered. Course fee required. Total of 30 hours of lecture.
