Club Description: The purpose of Phi Theta Kappa shall be to recognize and encourage scholarship among two-year college students. Mission: The Pi Theta Chapter of Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) at Hagerstown Community College is an international honor society that has two primary goals:

Eligibility: Students must have 12 college level credits completed as a full-time student or 15 college level credits completed as a part-time student and obtain a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.50. Membership is by invitation. Students that are eligible will receive invitations a few weeks after a new semester begins.

Institutional Learning Outcome/Goal: By engaging in the Pi Theta Chapter of Phi Theta Kappa, students will have opportunities for individual growth and development through participation in honors, leadership, service, and fellowship programming.

Objectives:

- *Leadership* will be promoted through the Honors Study topics and activities will encourage the development of leadership skills.
- Service projects will be developed to promote volunteering and community service.
- *Fellowship* will be encouraged through events that inspire a sense of cohesion.
- *Scholarship* students will be made aware that Phi Theta Kappa members have access to more than \$37 million in scholarships, a benefit unmatched by other honor societies.
- *Fundraising* will be organized to assist with the participation of each year's planned events (see below for 2014-2015 events).
