COORDINATE WITH OTHER AFFINITY GROUPS

• When possible, use a 'divide and conquer' strategy to manage tasks according to expertise of MCCCSAO, MCCADA, and MCCCPRO.

PROMOTE STUDENT ADVOCACY DAY WITH STUDENTS

- Generating "buzz" about Student Advocacy Day among students can help to increase social media activity.
- If your college has a college news team, be sure they cover Student Advocacy Day.
- Consider adding a Student Advocacy Day section on your college website.

PREPARE YOUR STUDENT ADVOCACY DAY TEAM

- Recommend that all Advocacy Day team members register to vote. To register, or update an existing voter registration, visit:

- Do a little *'homework'* on your local legislators:
 - Learn which committees they are on, their favorite issues, their social media profiles, and a little bit about their terms in office; this can help during student meetings.

 - Try to link legislators' favorite "causes" with issues your students may be able to speak to from either their personal or college experiences.
- Share *MACC's Student Advocacy Day Tool Kit* with Advocacy Day teams for tips on talking to legislators, social media, etc.
- Suggest team members send notes to thank legislators for their time and efforts supporting community colleges and students.
 - Having template thank you notes available for student team members to personalize can facilitate this important follow-up activity.

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VIRTUAL MEETINGS WITH LEGISLATORS

- Legislators welcome the opportunity to promote their participation in Student Advocacy Day. To help your legislators and students make the most of their time together:
 - Be sure your legislators' staffs, esp. **Media/Press Secretaries** (or staff who fill this role) have the Student Advocacy Day date and student team meeting time on their calendars.
 - Be sure your legislators' staffs know that your student team will actively promote their scheduled meetings with legislators on social media.

INCREASING ADVOCACY DAY PUBLICITY OUTSIDE OUR COMMUNITY COLLEGES

- Ensure that a savvy social media person is part of your Advocacy Day team.
- Suggest students write an opinion / essay about Student Advocacy Day either before or after the event provide their pieces to local newspapers and other media outlets.
- Seek out photo and video opportunities during Student Advocacy Day and post online.
- Promote Student Advocacy Day on college social media channels.
