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The TRIO Upward Bound program has been hosted by Hagerstown Community College since 2012. The goal of Upward Bound is to assist low-income, and/or first-generation college bound high school students in the successful completion of secondary education by preparing them academically as well as socially for enrollment and completion of higher education. Eligible project participants who demonstrate academic need may be identified at target high schools by teachers, counselors, parents, students, friends, as well as selected by Upward Bound staff. HCC Upward Bound provides opportunities to a minimum of 72 students annually from the following schools: Hancock Middle-Senior High School, North Hagerstown, South Hagerstown, and Williamsport High School. Students may also transfer and attend Washington County Technical High School, and remain in Upward Bound.

All UB students receive:

- After-school tutoring twice per week.
- Saturday Session workshops (offered once per month from 9am to 1 pm) that include financial aid and scholarship information, college and career research, guest speakers, etc.
- Academic guidance and counseling on a year-round basis.
- Various college visits (field trips) throughout the year.
- A rigorous six-week summer academy at HCC (tuition and fees paid for by grant funds).
- Student/community service learning hours.
- Transportation to and from activities.
- Breakfast and lunch during activities

2021 Summer Academy Opportunity for UB Students

A large component of the Upward Bound program is the six-week summer academy where students can earn either high school elective credit toward high school graduation, or college credit in general education courses (i.e. English 101). In order to register for college courses students must be 16 years of age and show that they are college ready by taking the HCC placement test or maintaining a cumulative high school G.P.A of 3.0. Students who have completed English and math 101 in a previous summer academy are exempt from taking the test. Classes run Monday through Thursday morning. Students are provided breakfast and lunch through the Washington County Public School system and all transportation is provided. In addition to coursework, field trips are incorporated on Fridays for college visits and cultural enrichment activities.

- Potential First Generation College Student
- Income Based Federal Guidelines
- Student at North, South,
 Williamsport, or Hancock
- 9th-11th grade
