# THE CAMPUS

Hagerstown Community College was founded in 1946 as the first of its kind in Maryland. The main campus sits on 319 acres and includes 18 buildings. HCC also operates a satellite center at the Valley Mall and a truck driving range in Hagerstown. More than 100 programs of study are available for university transfer, career preparation, and personal enrichment. HCC also offers non-credit continuing education courses and customized training programs, as well as remedial and developmental courses to help students prepare for college-level offerings. Accredited by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education HCC awards associate degrees, certificates, and letters of recognition.
