Paralegal Studies



What is a paralegal?

A paralegal is a person who has received specialized training through formal education or many years of work experience; works under the supervision and direction of an attorney; and performs non-clerical, substantive legal work in assisting an attorney (source: National Association of Legal Assistants).

Individuals who excel as paralegals possess excellent computer, interpersonal, organizational, research, speaking, and writing skills.

Where do paralegals work?

Paralegals are found in all types of organizations, but most work for law firms, corporations, and government agencies. The industries that employed most paralegals and legal assistants in 2021 were as follows:

Legal services 74%

Federal government, excluding post office 5%

Local government, excluding education and hospitals 4%

State government, excluding education and hospitals 3%

Finance and insurance 4%

Why should I come to HCC?
