# Financial Report as of August 31, 2022 (ACTION)

Vice President Soeffker-Culicerto gave a brief overview of the financial report. Ms. Brooks moved to accept the financial report as of September 30, 2022 as submitted. Mr. Newcomer seconded, and the motion carried by unanimous vote.

#### **Special Reports**

## FY22 Audit Committee (ACTION)

Trustee Abraham on behalf of Trustee Snook, Chair of Audit Committee, reported on the FY22 audit. The Audit Committee, comprised of Trustees Abraham, Proctor, and Snook; Vice President

Soeffker-Culicerto; Director Bittorf; and President Klauber, met with the auditors from Clifton, Larson, Allen LLP on October 13. The audit was clean. The auditors did need to make a correction from FY21 which has been fixed. The audit is still classed as unmodified clean audit. Trustee Abraham thanked Vice President Soeffker-Culicerto and Director Bittorf and their staff for doing a great job and for their dedication to the college. Mr. Newcomer moved to accept the FY22 audited financials. Ms. Brooks seconded, and the motion carried by unanimous vote.

# Fall Credit and Non-Credit Enrollment Report

Director Crawford discussed the fall credit enrollment report. Total headcount is down 2.8% white total FTE is down 4.4%. Out of State and Out of County have doubled in headcount and FTE.

Dr. Klauber for Dean Shank discussed the fall non-credit enrollment report. Total FTE is growing. The weakest numbers are in the prisons currently.

### Student Learning Outcome Assessment (SLOA)

Dean Renninger briefly discussed the SLOA report. The student learning outcomes assessment process is a continuous cycle as follows: (1) designing learning outcomes, (2) developing measures, (3) learning and educational experiences taking place, (4) collecting and analyzing assessment data, and (5) improving student learning. This approach provides the basis for ongoing assessment and improvement.

### Approve FY23 Board Goals (ACTION)

Mr. Abraham moved to approve the FY23 Board Goals as submitted. Ms. Lampton seconded, and the motion carried by unanimous vote.

# Open Meetings Act Training (ACTION)

Dr. Klauber asked the Board to designate Rebecca Shives to take the Open Meetings Act Training. Mr. Williamson suggested all the trustees take this training. Ms. Brooks moved to designate Rebecca Shives to take the Open Meetings Act Training. Ms. Lampton seconded, and the motion carried by unanimous vote.

#### Tuition Adjustment (ACTION)

Dr. Klauber presented a tuition adjustment for all dual credit students in In County, Out of County, Out of State, and Neighbor Rate students to receive 75% discount. Mr. Newcomer moved to approve the tuition adjustment for all dual credit students. Ms. Brooks seconded, and the motion carried by unanimous vote.

### Holiday Calendar FY23 Modification (ACTION)

The Holiday Calendar for FY23 was revised to return after Winter Break on Tuesday, January 3rd. Mr. Abraham moved to approve as submitted. Ms. Lampton seconded, and the motion carried by unanimous vote.

## Holiday Calendar FY24 (ACTION)

Ms. Lampton moved to approve the Holiday Calendar for FY24 as submitted. Ms. Brooks seconded, and the motion carried by unanimous vote.

#### Academic Calendar FY24 (ACTION)

Mr. Abraham moved to approve the Academic Calendar for FY24 as submitted. Mr. Williamson seconded, and the motion carried by unanimous vote.

### Change to President's Contract (ACTION)

Mr. Abraham brought an action for the President's Contract. This action recommends extending the term of the employment contract two (2) additional years to June 30, 2026; and that the Board shall, no later than June 30, 2025, either negotiate a further extension of the contract or provide the president notice of non-renewal, and increasing the option of a transportation allowance to \$12,000 per year effective retroactively to July 1, 2022. Ms. Brooks moved to approve this recommendation. Ms. Lampton seconded, and the motion carried by unanimous vote.

#### Triad Presentation

Mr. Wolf, Mr. Swailes, and Ms. Popovich from Triad discussed the design for Phase I of the Scholar Drive Road Realignment as well as wayfinding signage. Triad has worked on many projects at HCC in the past.
