## WHAT IS THE COMMERCIAL VEHICLE TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM?

The Commercial Vehicle Transportation (CVT) program is a comprehensive program designed to guide students into the transportation industry by giving them an opportunity to study for Class A and Class B commercial drivers licenses. Students receive classroom instruction and experience behind-the-wheel truck driving. The transportation pathway is further extended into transportation management and administration through a certificate and degree program.

## WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF TRUCK DRIVER TRAINING AT HCC?

#### Classes are available to suit your schedule:

- Weekday sessions are held Monday through Friday, from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
- Weekend sessions are held Saturday from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. and Sunday, from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- Standard class size is 20 students or less with a maximum one-to-four ratio

### Job placement assistance is offered:

Local and nationally-based trucking companies frequently visit each class to recruit drivers.

### Decent starting pay:


As an entry-level Class A driver, starting pay typically averages between \$60,000 to \$75,000 per year (U.S. Dept. of Labor).

## **FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS**

#### Is tuition assistance or financial aid available?

Yes, HCC's CVT program is accredited and many students qualify for financial aid. Financial aid options include:

- Federal financial aid including student loans\*
- No-interest payment plan
- Veteran (VA) financing available\*\*
- \* Students may apply for a Pell Grant or a low-interest Stafford Loan.
- \*\* To find out if you are eligible to receive VA benefits, go to www.hagerstowncc.edu/veterans.



## What are the requirements to enter the program?

- Must possess a valid license and be 18 years of age
- Must be able to pass a DOT physical and drug screen
- Must be able to communicate in English sufficiently, as required by the U.S. Dept. of Transportation.
- Applicants must pass college assessment test.
- Must perform all technical standards associated with the CVT Program
- Must have CDL Class A Learner's Permit
- Must grant permission to complete a full query on FMCSA DOT Clearinghouse, which must show no restriction

## Do I need to transfer my license to Maryland if I'm not a Maryland resident?

No, if you are currently licensed in Pa., W.Va., or Va., CDL testing and licensing will take place in your state of residence.

#### What credentials will I receive upon completion?

- A Class A CDL through your state of residence once you pass the driving test
- 16 college credits, some of which can be applied towards a certificate or an associate's degree from HCC

#### **HOW IS THE PROGRAM STRUCTURED?**

This 16-credit program includes a combination of classroom instruction and range and road training (TRK 108, 110, 112, and 115).

#### Classroom instruction

Tobics covered include:

- Trucking industry introduction including service hours
- Endorsements: HazMat, tankers and doubles and triples
- Federal motor carriers safety regulations
- State and federal motor traffic laws
- Trip planning and map reading
- Defensive driving certification
- DOT pre-trip safety inspections
- Employment preparation

### Range and road instruction

Tobics covered include:

- Basic vehicle control and vehicle control systems
- Shifting, cornering, and maneuvering, which includes front line stopping, straight line backing, serpentine backing, parallel parking, and alley docking
- Emergency procedures and hazard perception
- Safety and defensive driving including visual searching
- Speed and space management including passing and meeting other vehicles
- MVA testing
- \* This course provides the major skills training and practice necessary to prepare for state CDL Class A driving exam. A CDL Class A learner's permit is required to take this course.

#### **Program Fees**

Tuition costs are determined by state of residency. For current tuition costs, go to www.hagerstowncc.edu/finance.

## Additional fees

Prior to the start of class, students must have the following:

- DOT physical and a 10-panel drug screen. Exams can be done at Health@Work in Hagerstown (240-313-9910). The DOT form may be picked up at the MVA.
- Copy of driver's record from the MVA. Please check for outstanding violations that would prevent you from obtaining your CDL permit or license.
- CDL learner's permit. Pick up the free commercial driver license manual at the MVA and study chapters one through six for the written exam. The practice Web site for the learner's permit is www.thetruckersreport.com.
- Textbooks
- FMCSA Clearinghouse requires a DOT full query be completed, for which student must register and pay \$1.25.

## PROGRAM OPTIONS

## Certificate **COMMERCIAL VEHICLE** TRANSPORTATION SPECIALIST

This skills-oriented program leads to a commercial vehicle transportation specialist certificate and is for those individuals seeking a career in professional truck driving. The curriculum consists of classroom, skills, and field instruction and is based on industry recognized skill standards.

Successful students will be eligible to test for a Class A commercial vehicle license with air brakes, combinations, doubles/triples, tankers, and hazardous materials endorsements, as well as the Defensive Driving Certification. Interested individuals must have a valid driver's license from Maryland, Pennsylvania, West Virginia, or Virginia, a CDL Class A Learner's Permit, and must pass a Department of Transportation physical examination and drug screen.

The certificate is designed for the individual who is working in the movement of raw materials and freight to manufacturing, warehousing, and retail facilities. Successful students will be prepared for the following job titles: distribution manager, traffic manager, truck driver dispatcher, logistics salesman, andfreight-forwarder. Students may choose either Track I or Track II to earn this certificate. Students who currently possess a valid Commercial Driver's License (CDL) may petition to receive college credit for TRK 112 and TRK 115.

## A.A.S. Degree **COMMERCIAL TRANSPORTATION ADMINISTRATION**

The Commercial Transportation Administration program is for students interested in the movement of raw materials and freight to manufacturing, warehousing, and retail facilities. Students are expected to acquire basic competence in a wide range of business and management functions, and the program will provide a broad educational experience designed to develop and improve management effectiveness. Students will also examine the outside forces that influence business and management, and consider the responsibilities of business and management in society. Upon completion of this program, students will be prepared for the following job titles: distribution manager, traffic manager, truck driver, dispatcher, logistics salesman, freight-forwarder, load optimization specialist, supervisor, administrator, manager, general manager of transportation and logistics, and director. Students who currently possess a valid Commercial Driver's License (CDL) may petition to receive college credit for TRK 112 and TRK 115. This program can be earned entirely through online courses.
