Dr. Dave Warner: Cheers to a successful career!



After 30 years at HCC, Dr. David Warner will be retiring in June from his position as Vice President of Academic Affairs and Student Services. The Advisor caught up with Dr. Warner to reflect on his time here at the college and learn more about his plans for retirement.

Dr. Warner, as you prepare to retire, what are some of your favorite memories from your time here? As a student: I enjoyed playing acoustic guitar in the Student Center Coffee Houses. You could drink beer and wine at age 18 and those events were great fun. I remember taking music classes with C. Randall Williams, Chorus with Vaughn Crowl, Creative Writing with Carol Campbell, History of Civilization with Pat Jennings, General Psychology with Gil Hull, Basic Drawing and Painting with Roz Rutstein, American History with Larry Sharpe, General Biology with Dick Montgomery, and Twentieth Century Drama with John Astegher. These professors had a profound impact on my life and on the future educator I would become. As an Administrator: I really enjoyed my time as a faculty member, but I think I was the happiest professionally when I was serving as the Humanities Division Chair. We had faculty elected chairs then so I was able to teach a few classes and have a hand in building the budget, hiring faculty, and creating new programs. I created the Music concentration in the Associate of Arts degree and the Applied Music Program in 1989, and served on the committee working to build the Alumni Amphitheater.

What are some of the accomplishments that you are most proud of during your time as VP of Academic Affairs and Student Services? I enjoyed playing a part in creating the many new academic programs we started such as Dental Hygiene, Advanced Manufacturing, Dance, Health Information Management, Police Academy, Medical Lab Technician, Medical Sonography and many more. I liked helping launch the Middle College, and I am particularly proud of the revisions we made to the Developmental Education Program in reducing the number of developmental courses required for admission to credit bearing classes. I am proud of the changes we made to the admission standards by implementing the 3.0 cumulative high school GPA to enter credit classes and bypass placement testing. And I am very proud of the work we've done in implementing the Kirwan Blueprint for Education, providing free community college education to qualified Washington County Public School students.

You are an accomplished musician. What role does music play in your academic and professional career? I learned early in my life that the show must go on. No matter what happens you keep playing until the end, continuously adjusting to enhance the production, all the while smiling and acting as if nothing is wrong. It taught me how to thrive in chaos.

What else would you like our students and community to know about you? I've been happily married to my wife, Debbie, for 38 years. We have a wonderful family for which I will be forever grateful. I played bass in the 80s in the Philadelphia/New Jersey area with Eddie Holman, the Gold Record award winner for the song "Hey There Lonely Girl." I tried very hard to give back to this wonderful institution that gave so much to me. I hope I evened the score.



Celebrating successful programs: HCC's Adult Literacy Services

The Hagerstown Community College's Program of Adult Literacy Services (PALS) is proud to be the home of the Adult Education Program for Washington County. PALS has provided free literacy services to over 600 students annually for over 20 years. Due to the increased need for adult literacy services in the area, over 1,000 students will be serviced this year.

Over 600 English language learners came from countries such as El Salvador, Mexico, Guatemala, Honduras, Brazil, Peru, Haiti, Columbia, China, Russia, Ukraine, Turkey, Sudan, Nigeria and others.

One of the most rewarding Adult Education programs provides services for English Language

Learners (ELL). The ELL program includes three main programs to support student success:

- The ELL Family Literacy Program partners with the Washington County Family Center to offer classes to improve parenting skills as well as to provide transportation, childcare, and meals to families in the program.
- Traditional English language classes are offered to improve English language acquisition skills and focuses in the areas of writing, reading, speaking, and listening. These classes range in serving learners with no English language skills, to those who are well-versed in English and may be seeking options to earn a high school credential, transition into a short-term workforce training program, or begin their post-secondary educational pathway.



The Integrated English Language Civics Education and Integrated Education Training Program (IELCE-IET) assists students who are enrolled in HCC's Workforce Solutions & Continuing Education programs. This program co-enrolls students in an English companion course through PALS, providing language support to optimize success in the workforce training program. All of these courses are offered free of charge to learners inclusive of the workforce training programs.

C.N.A. and Phlebotomy programs are offered by PALS in collaboration with Workforce Solutions & Continuing Education, making for a great connection for English language learners to access the workforce in less than a year. These programs are offered at no charge to eligible students due to financial support by HCC Foundation scholarships in conjunction with funding from the Western Maryland Consortium and Maryland Department of Labor. Instructors for both the workforce training and English companion course work closely together from the point of initial planning through completion of the course. For students to receive hands-on experience, both Meritus Health and the Fahrney-Keedy Senior Living Community provide internships for students in the IELCE-IET program.
