What is the Psychology Program?

Psychology is broadly defined as the scientific study of the mind and behavior. The Psychology Program at HCC offers an Associate of Arts Degree (A.A.) in Psychology. The program includes courses for students who intend to transfer to a four-year college to complete the bachelor's degree. Specialized topics in psychology are very diverse. They include, among many others, biopsychology and neuropsychology, learning and memory, health psychology, sports and performance psychology, social persuasion and influence, child, adolescent and adult development, forensic psychology and profiling, personality theory, personal relationships in families, interpersonal attraction, and psychopathology.


What is the employment outlook for this career field?

Individuals who work in this profession are often people-oriented, have excellent communication skills (both written and oral), and are organized and extremely empathic as well as being good at establishing relationships with others. They also have a true desire to help others to improve their lives, circumstances and the world around them.

Those majoring in psychology can choose from a plethora of career options such as: teacher, mental health clinician, sports coach, school counselor, career counselor, parole officer, marketing, advertising, psychological research, social services, public relations, medical services, sales, social worker and human resources.

In some instances, students' career objectives will lead them to pursue a graduate degree in psychology in addition to the bachelor's degree.

The median annual wage of people with a bachelor's in psychology is around \$90K. There are approximately 196,000 psychology jobs in the United States with approximately 630 psychologists working in Maryland.
