

# PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

- 78% of participants served will have a 2.5 cumulative GPA or better
- **70%** of UB seniors will have achieved at the **proficient level on state assessments** in reading/language arts and math.
- 97% of participants will continue in school for the next academic year, at the next grade level, or will graduate.
- 75% of current and prior UB participants will complete a rigorous secondary school program of study.
- 68% of UB graduates will enroll in a program of postsecondary education by the fall term immediately following high school graduation (exception: spring deferment).
- 60% of all participants who enroll in college, by the fall term, will attain either an associate's or bachelor's degree within six years following graduation from high school.

# POINT SYSTEM

Students who participate in UB activities, and those who go above and beyond the minimum requirements of the program, accrue points which will determine eligibility for the "incentive trip". - Must create FSA log-in information
- Must bring with you on October 14<sup>th</sup> :
  - 1. FSA log-in information for both student & parent
  - 2. Tax returns/transcripts for both student & parent
  - 3. College folder student

Create a college binder with tabs to organize applications.

Prepare for Entrance Exams - Take the SAT or ACT early. SAT Dates: Oct 1 and Nov 5. ACT Dates: Oct 22 and Dec 10

Make sure your high school counselor/Upward Bound Advisor knows what you're looking for in a college so he/she can assist you n choosing the best one for you.

(now how to apply to each school you are interested in. Create a Common Application account if the colleges you've selected use it.

inalize your college essays

Create a financial aid folder/section with all important dates, deadlines and information.

Be sure to have either visited each college physically, or completed a virtual tour of the college before considering it as ar option.

#### October to November

Submit the FAFSA - opens October 1st. <u>FAFSA LAB at October 15 UB Saturday session</u> from 10:00am - 12:00pm. Many other opportunities to attend workshops throughout the county to help with this process.

October 16, 2016 - Attend HCC's College Fair, talk to the admission representatives at the schools you are applying too. They will be making admission decisions.

Request letters of recommendation - give a written request with details and provide a stamped envelope with college address.

Watch admission deadlines. Submit applications by Thanksgiving break if you have not already applied. Keep track of all application components and deadlines: applications, test scores, letters of recommendation and financial aid materials.

December to January

Follow-up to ensure letters of recommendations were received by the college. Send "thank you" notes to recommenders.

Search for Scholarships - Talk to your high school counselor about local scholarships and get the applications. Keep checking back periodically throughout the year for information on the latest scholarships.

Contact colleges to confirm admissions received all of the required documents for review.

Attend a Financial Aid Night at your school.

Talk with college students who are home from college.

Apply for scholarships at the colleges you applied to, know the deadlines.

February to May

Watch out for notifications from colleges. Email Upward Bound copies of your acceptance letters.

Financial Aid Award Letters will be sent to you. Review all before making a decision - consult counselor with questions.

Continue to submit scholarship applications, most community scholarships are due during these months.

Choose a college, confirm arrangements for payment and housing.
