What is the Dance Program?

HCC's Dance Program is designed for students who plan to transfer to a four-year college as dance majors and offers the opportunity to develop foundational skills in concert dance technique, performance, improvisation, composition, and audition skills necessary for them to succeed in upper division dance courses. Core dance courses provide training and practice in the essential areas of dance listed above, as well as extensive exposure to a diverse array of dance studies and contemporary dance practices.

What can I do with my dance degree?

There is a wide variety of opportunities for a candidate with a dance degree. In addition to dance performance, graduates with dance degrees often pursue the following careers:

Although a bachelor's degree is recommended for many of these career options, students may enter some of these fields with an associate degree, especially if they have developed strong technique, performance, and choreographic ability.

What is the employment outlook?

Earnings and employment will vary by location, industry, education, and experience; however, there is a projected 13 percent increase from 2012-2022 in dance-related jobs. The following data indicates the current job demand in Maryland, as well as national statistics for currently employed persons in dance related fields.

Why should I study dance at HCC?

Students enjoy small class sizes and apply their acquired skills in each studio dance course through performances every semester. The dance faculty hold master's and/or bachelor's degrees from prestigious schools and come from professional performance careers with elite dance companies and theatrical venues, including the Joffrey Ballet Company. They also remain current in their fields of study by performing professionally, taking classes and workshops, and giving master classes.

The required capstone project allows each student to fully develop an original creative work from the ground up, including: working with a professional costume designer, lighting designer, and set designer; choreographing and rehearsing the piece with dance company members; and readying the piece for performance for a live audience. Dancers who are involved in their capstone project year will also be offered unique performance opportunities on and off campus.

What are the program options?

Students can earn an associate of art degree in dance. With the completion of this degree, students will have completed the first two years of study toward a bachelor's degree in dance and be prepared to transfer into a competitive dance program at a four-year college or university, such as the in-state options listed below:

The Dance Program provides a foundation of ballet, modern, and jazz courses to strengthen dance technique. These courses are paired with creative composition and improvisation courses to provide students with unique strategies for building movement material and creating original works. Finally, music and theater courses provide dancers with knowledge of the technical aspects of dance performance. This degree prepares students for transfer to a four-year institution to pursue a bachelor's degree.
