


Medical Coding and Reimbursement Specialist





What do medical coding and reimbursement specialists do?

A coding specialist is a type of health information technician who analyzes and codes medical record information for reimbursement purposes. Coding specialists assign codes to each diagnosis and procedure through the use of both manual and electronic classification systems. Medical insurance programs reimburse for medical care based on medical coding. Coding specialists may use several coding systems for hospital, physician, and ambulatory care settings.

What type of skills are needed to excel in this field?

Coding specialists need to possess an excellent attention to detail, be well-organized, punctual, mature and professional, and work well with others.

What is the employment outlook for a coding specialist?

Healthcare information is a fast growing industry. Employment of health information technicians is expected to increase 13 percent from 2016 to 2026. Employment growth will result from increasing numbers of medical tests, procedures, and treatments. Coding specialists that demonstrate a strong understanding of computer technologies will be in particularly high demand (source: www.bls.gov/ooh).

What is the estimated salary for a coding specialist?

The median annual wage of health information technicians was \$38,040 in May 2016 (source: www.bls.gov/ooh).

Where do coding specialists work?

Coding specialists work in hospitals, physician offices, clinics, and other healthcare settings such as medical insurance companies and quality review organizations.

Are there advancement opportunities for coding specialists?

Coding specialists may advance to managerial or other administrative positions. In addition, some may choose to continue their education and become a registered health information technician (RHIT).

Are there any disqualifying crimes that prevent individuals from working in the field?

Yes, individuals who commit felonies such as murder, assault and battery, sexual assault, prescription drug fraud, drug possession with an intent to distribute, etc., are ineligible for employment as a medical coding specialist.

Is the Medical Coding and Reimbursement Specialist Program accredited?

HCC is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools, and is a member of the American Association of Community Colleges.

Will I be eligible to take a national credentialing exam?

Students who successfully complete the program are eligible to sit for the American Association of Professional Coders (AAPC) Certified Professional Coder-Apprentice (CPC-A) exam and the American Health Information Management Association (AHIMA) Certified Coding Associate (CCA) exam. Following a minimum of one year of employment, coders are then eligible to advance to Certified Professional Coder (CPC) or Certified Coding Specialist (CCS) status.

Does HCC assist with job placement?

HCC has a workplace learning advisor to assist you to improve your job search skills.

How long does it take to complete the program?

Completion time depends on whether the student attends full or part-time. If the student attends full-time, the program can be completed in three semesters. The above time frame is based on the student meeting all prerequisite standards.

Why should I choose HCC?

Certificate

Medical Coding and Reimbursement Specialist

This certificate program is designed for the student interested in specializing in a career

in medical insurance coding and billing. Curriculum is structured to provide the student with lecture as well as competencybased training in medical procedural coding and diagnosis coding as well as third party reimbursement procedures. Medical coding and reimbursement certificate students must maintain a grade of "C" or better in all program courses. Students may be required to repeat MAP and/or PLB courses, based upon the time sequence when these program courses were completed. Successful graduates are prepared to pursue positions in medical billing offices, medical collection agencies, and insurance companies. Successful graduates are also eligible to sit for national certification exams as a professional coder and reimbursement specialist.*
