**Overview of Shippensburg University's General Education Program**

The General Education Program at Shippensburg University comprises forty-eight of the credit hours required for graduation.

-Part 1: <sup>R</sup>Required Skills and Competencies (Basic Skills Requirements) 15 credits

- This specific set of courses is required to be completed by all students
- ENG 114, HCS 100, College Level Math, HIS 105, HIS 106

-Part 2: Categories of Knowledge 34 credits

- <sup>A</sup>Category A Logic & Numbers for Rational Thinking (1 course – 3 credits)
- <sup>B</sup>Category B Linguistic, Literary, Artistic, & Cultural Traditions (3 courses – 9 credits)
- <sup>C</sup>Category C Biological & Physical Sciences (3 courses – 9 credits)
- <sup>D</sup>Category D Political, Economic, and Geographic Sciences (2 courses – 7 credits)
- <sup>E</sup>Category E Social and Behavioral Sciences (2 courses – 6 credits)

**NOTES (IMPORTANT – PLEASE READ)**

- A. Additional transfer credits may be taken at HCC for transfer to Shippensburg. Please speak with your advisor and/or the SU transfer counselor for advisement on additional coursework.
- B. 0-Level courses do not count toward graduation requirements and will not transfer. HD courses may not transfer.
- C. Courses for Shippensburg University have been selected by joint agreement of HCC and SU. However, curricula are subject to change. Please speak with your advisor and/or the SU transfer counselor if you have any questions. A transfer counselor from SU visits the campus on a regular basis through the academic year. Call the SU Office of Admissions for the specific day and time.
- D. B.A. Students must satisfy the Novice level competency in a foreign language. This is accomplished via 3 years of the same language in high school, an AP score of at least 3, or the completion of a 103 level course.
